#### **Patriotic Exercises:**

On this day in 1888, one of the worst blizzards in American history strikes the Northeast, killing more than 400 people and dumping as much as 55 inches of snow in some areas.

On March 12, 1933, eight days after his inauguration, President Franklin D. Roosevelt gives his first national radio address—or "fireside chat"—broadcast directly from the White House.

On March 13, 1865, with the main Rebel armies facing long odds against much larger Union armies, the Confederacy approves the use of Black troops.

On March 14, 1879, Albert Einstein is born, the son of a Jewish electrical engineer in Ulm, Germany. Einstein's theories of special and general relativity drastically altered human understanding of the universe, and his work in particle and energy theory helped make possible quantum mechanics and, ultimately, the atomic bomb.

On March 15, 1965, President Lyndon B. Johnson addresses a joint session of Congress to urge the passage of legislation guaranteeing voting rights for all.

Using the phrase "we shall overcome," borrowed from African American leaders struggling for equal rights, Johnson declares that "every American citizen must have an equal right to vote."

#### **AVID News**

### **Vice Principal Announcements:**

Checking out early: If a student needs to check out early for any reason their parent/guardian must call ahead to let the front office know. The front office will send a call slip to release the student from class at the requested time. This includes athletes- all athletes MUST check out at the front office before leaving campus for games.

Cell Phones/Headphones: Cell phones and headphones should be put away in backpacks throughout the instructional day. If cell phones or headphones are seen at all they may be taken by staff to the office. Please have your cell phones and headphones off an in your backpack during class and passing periods.

Dress Code: Please adhere to the student dress code found in the student handbook.

Tardy to Class: Holmes Junior High will follow the rules in the student handbook. Students must be on time to class. This is important because every minute counts and we want to show our Patriot P.R.I.D.E. by being a respectful member of this community. Tardiness interrupts the learning environment for the tardy student and those who are engaged in learning. Consequences for being tardy have begun including minor referrals and lunch detention.

Attendance: Our goal is 100% attendance every day for all students. Academic success is related to attendance. It is important that you are at school every day prepared and ready to learn.

PE Dismissal and Red Line: Students need to stay behind the red line on the blacktop during the end of PE until the final bell of the period rings.

P.B.I.S. School-wide PBIS is a multi-tiered framework to make schools more effective places. It establishes a social culture and the behavior supports needed to improve social, emotional, behavioral, and academic outcomes for all students. At Holmes this includes being recognized for positive behavior with "Got Caught" cards, and having consequences for minor behavior (minor referrals). We engage in a restorative process to address minor discipline issues at Holmes. Students have several opportunities to learn from mistakes and correct their behavior. After four minor referrals the consequence is a restorative lunch with time to reflect on how to make positive choices throughout the school day. Please work with your teachers to understand and follow classroom rules and expectations.

Safety: Student safety is our priority. Please make sure you are being safe by keeping hands off of your peers and walking in the hallways.

Please make sure your locker is cleaned out over night and your bike is not left on campus over night. This will help to prevent theft throughout the night when staff is not present.

Student incident reports: Thank you all for committing to campus safety by using the online student incident reporting form. You can find the link to this form in the Patriot Portal. The Vice Principal, Mrs. Sanchez checks these several times a day and takes your reports seriously.
